2018 December Summary

Bottom Line: Multiple agencies participated in monitoring Asian Carp (Bighead Carp, Black Carp, Grass Carp, and Silver Carp) in the upper Illinois Waterway downstream of the Electric Dispersal Barrier during December. NO LIVE BIGHEAD CARP, BLACK CARP, GRASS CARP OR SILVER CARP were found in any new locations immediately downstream of the Electric Dispersal Barrier.

Asian Carp Removal Project

Removal takes place specifically in the Marseilles and Starved Rock Pools. Below is a summary of all Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Barrier Defense activities through December 2018, along with the same time period in 2016 and 2017 for comparison:

Using Long-term Asian Carp Abundance and Movement Data to Reduce Uncertainty of Management Decisions

Data from mobile hydroacoustic surveys collected throughout the Illinois River (Alton – Dresden Island pools) in October and November 2018 were being analyzed. These data will be used to determine long-term (2012-2019) trends in bigheaded carp densities, as well as changes in densities in Dresden Island Pool following the fall Unified Method bigheaded carp harvest.

Bigheaded carp telemetry data were downloaded from acoustic telemetry receivers in Alton – Dresden Island pools were also being processed for quality assurance/ quality control (QA/QC), number of upstream and downstream lock and dam passages throughout the river, and movements in Dresden Island Pool during the October Unified Method. All fish movement data occurring in 2018 were also extracted from the database for inclusion in the USGS FishTracks database. Telemetry data collected before, during, and after the Dresden Unified Method has also been identified and will be combined with other agencies' telemetry data and information on boat movements to examine fish responses to Unified Method herding. Upstream passages did occur at two upper Illinois River dams in 2018. One Bighead Carp passed upstream through the lock at Dresden Island Lock and Dam in fall 2018 (between 8/10/18 and 10/19/18). This same individual also passed upstream through the dam in late 2017 or early 2018. One Silver Carp passed upstream through the lock at Starved Rock Lock and Dam on 6/2/18. No upstream passages were recorded at Marseilles Lock and Dam in 2018.
